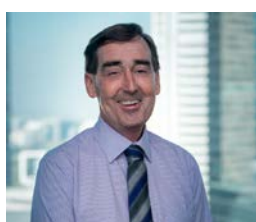

Mei's responsibilities include forecasting external drivers that impact Liberty Steel, market intelligence and insights. She is passionate with researching the commodities and steel markets as well as keeping track of the performance of China and other major economies as well as the Australian economy.
