Subject: Driver Cuts Hand on Dog Bar

Date:(mth/yr) March 2005

**Incident:** (Brief facts only, do not include company name or location, insert picture if available)

Truck Driver was dogging down a coil when the poly angle settled as the chain tensioned.
This caused the driver's hand to slip off the dog bar, and catch on a small barb of metal on the dog bar causing a laceration to hand requiring 3 stitches

## **Key Lessons**: (maximum of 3)

- Drivers should only use dog bars in good condition and working order, ie should not use worn or old dog bars
- Drivers should wear gloves when dogging down to avoid injury

## **Recommendations**: (maximum of 3)

- Communicate incident to all transport companies and drivers advising them to review and replace old or worn dog bars
- Driver to be given a new dog bar
- Drivers to wear gloves when dogging down loads
